Bespoke 4x4 and trailer driver safety course for The Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority

In May 2021, DriveTech provided a behaviour-changing, bespoke 4x4 and trailer driver safety course for The Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority.

The Yorkshire Dales National Park is an area of extraordinary natural beauty, covering 2,179 square kilometres and is one of the UK's 15 designated national parks. The Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority was created to help care for this very special place, its landscape, wildlife, culture and heritage, and to help people understand and enjoy it. Working consultatively, DriveTech put together a behaviour-changing specific 4x4 trailer course that covered a wealth of off-road and 4x4 knowledge that empowered drivers to make mindful, safe driving decisions. The course included:

- ▶ HSE /PUWER regulations
- ▶ Identifying vehicle and trailer load and towing capabilities
- ▶ Pre-drive checks on vehicle and trailer, identifying capacities, VIN plates, lashing points.
- ▶ Estimating and positioning loads of different materials
- ▶ Types of tie down systems
- ▶ Securing different loads with different lashing systems
- ▶ Safely coupling and uncoupling a trailer
- ▶ Close manoeuvring a combination forward and in reverse
- ▶ Route selection when towing
- ▶ Parking and leaving a trailer
